## **Dunkettle Interchange Project:**

Upgrade Dunkettle to a largely free-flow interchange to alleviate traffic congestion.

- Detailed design is ongoing, incorporating the extensive information obtained on ground conditions from the recently completed Site Investigations.
- Planning and co-ordination meetings are ongoing with stakeholders such as Irish Water, the Jack Lynch Tunnel Operator, and TII network Operations to agree solutions in advance of works commencing wherever possible.
- The Dunkettle team recently briefed the Cork Inter-Agency Emergency Services group on the Dunkettle Upgrade Scheme. The Inter-Agency Group represents An Garda Siochana, the Ambulance Service, and Cork City and County Fire Services. Discussions focused on maintaining access to the Tunnel, to road traffic incidents, and chemical sites in the area.
- Environmental Mitigation Works and management of Invasive Species continues ahead of main construction works. The photo below shows the Spanish Bluebell which is classed as an invasive plant in Ireland being removed from site.
